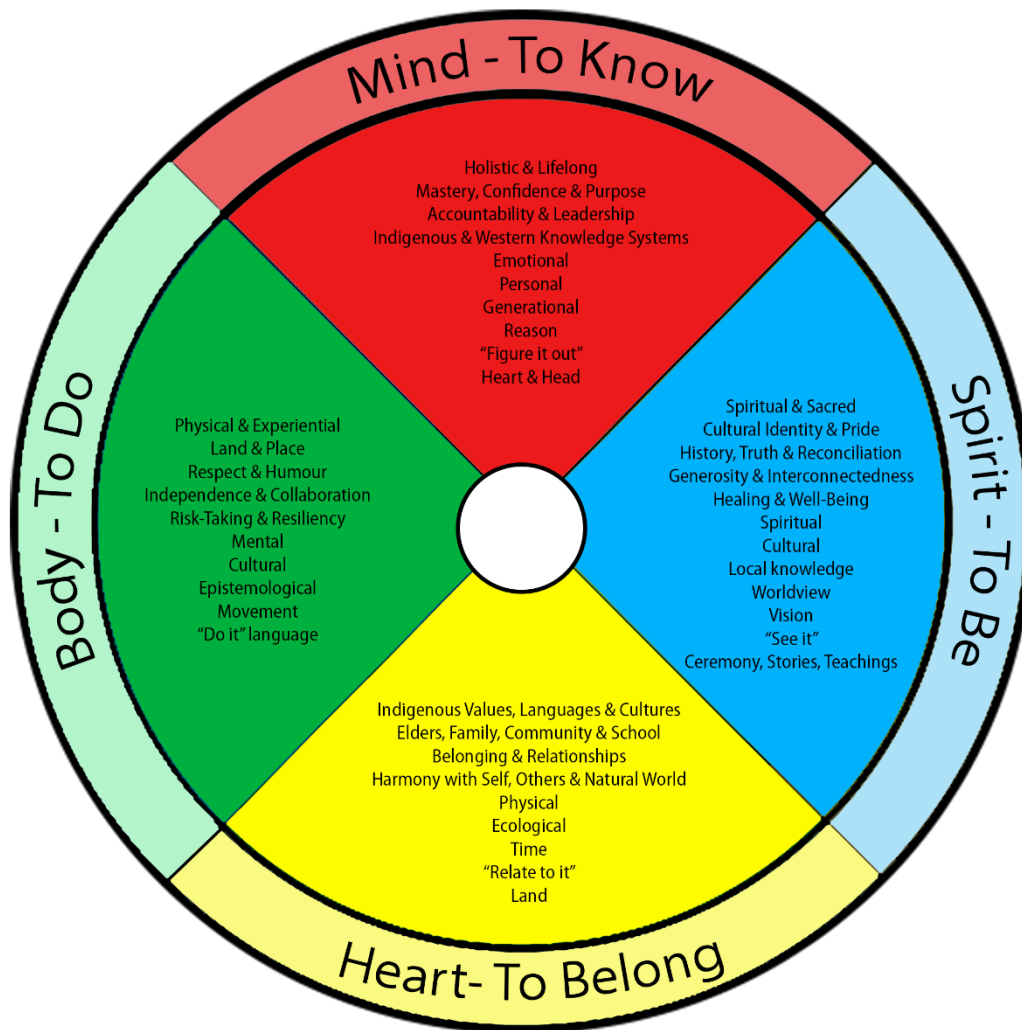


Holistic Observation of Students Assignment #1 Look at your students in a holistic way.

- Child-centered.

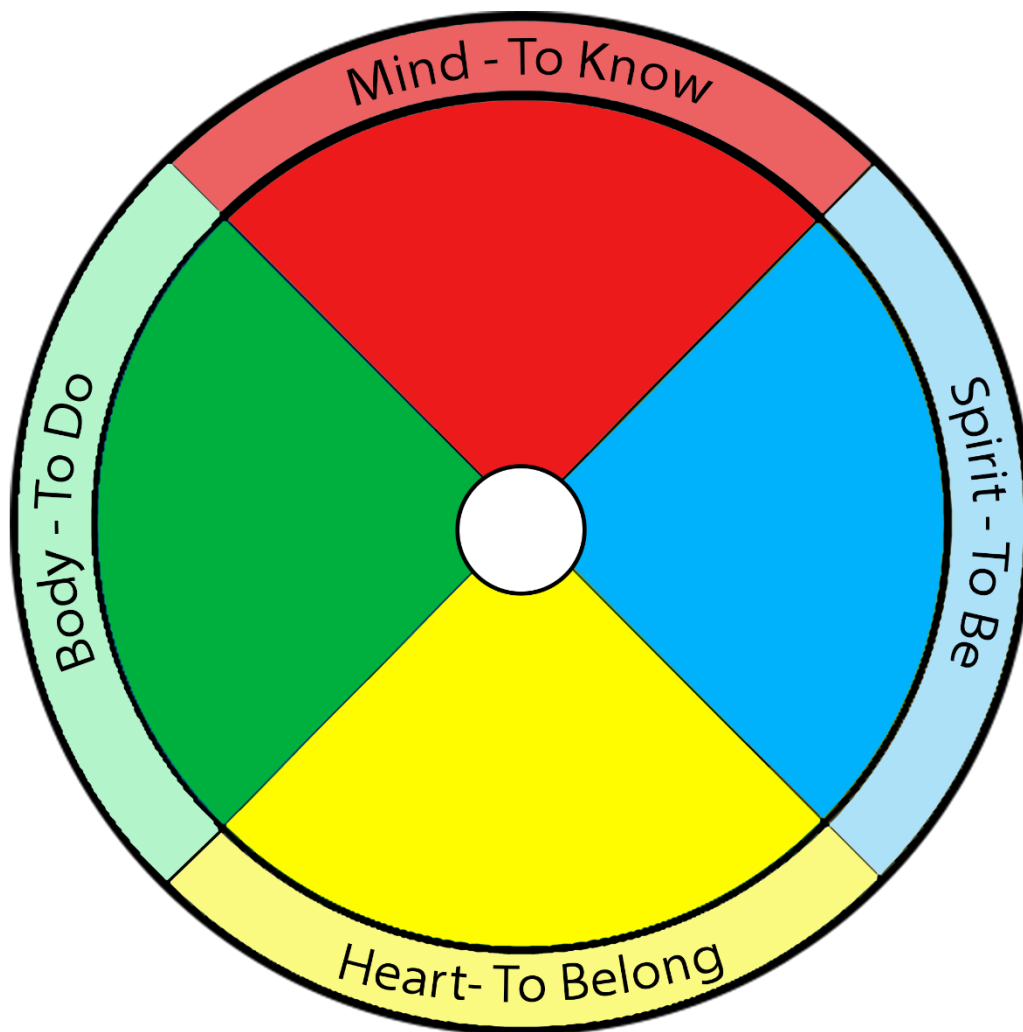
