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## \*Other External Requirements:

- If any external requirement course is part of Teaching Area 1 or 2, then the requirement will be fulfilled by courses within the Teaching Area.
- <u>Exception:</u> If English, Social Studies and/or Indigenous Studies are Teaching Areas, then **at least one (and at most two)** of the external requirements are replaced with an external elective.

## Teaching Area Options for Early/Middle Years B.Ed.:

All students in the Early/Middle Years B.Ed. program are required to have two teaching areas:

- Teaching Area options are listed below. Complete program requirements, including a list of courses that
  meet the teaching area requirements can be found at programs.usask.ca under "Colleges and schools" >
  "Education" > Bachelor of Education > B.Ed. Early/Middle Years Program.
- 2. The Early/Middle Years **Teaching Area 1** requires a total of 18 credit units: 6 junior (100-level) credit units and 12 (200-level or higher) credit units.\*
- 3. The Early/Middle Years **Teaching Area 2** requires a total of 12 credit units: 6 junior (100-level) credit units and 6 senior (200-level or higher) credit units.\*
  - \* Some teaching areas allow 100-level courses taken after the first 6 credit units to be counted as senior courses. Please consult an academic advisor or the University Catalogue (programs.usask.ca) for details.
- 4. If Social Sciences/Social Studies is one of your teaching areas, at least 6 credit units must contain Canadian content. See the University Catalogue (programs.usask.ca) for a list of courses that have Canadian content.
- Students may choose Social Sciences/Social Studies <u>OR</u> Indigenous Studies as a Teaching Area, but cannot choose both.
- 6. If Cree or French or Languages is one of your teaching areas:
  - only 3 credit units of English are required. If English Language Arts <u>and</u> Cree, French or Languages are Teaching Areas, then English requirements are part of Teaching Area only.
  - ii. ECUR 412.3: Examining Place, Purpose, Program Design is required instead of EADM/ECUR/EFDT/EPSE 411.3.
  - iii. ECUR 362.3: Introduction to Principles and Practices of Second Language Teaching is required instead of 3 credit units of Education elective.
