The Bachelor of Science Kinesiology/Bachelor of Education Combined Program is designed for those students who wish to teach Physical Education at the Secondary level. All students in the Kinesiology/Education Combined Program have two teaching areas:

- 1. Teaching Area 1 is Physical Education. Teaching Area 1 must have a minimum average of 60%.
- 2. Teaching Area 2 options are listed below. In most cases, Teaching Area 2 requires 6 junior (100-level) credit units and 9 senior (200-level or higher) credit units. Teaching Area 2 must have a minimum average of 60%. - 3. *If **Mathematics** is your Teaching Area 2, you must complete MATH 110.3.
- If Social Sciences/Social Studies is your Teaching Area 2, at least 6 credit units must contain Canadian content.

- 5. **If Indigenous Studies or Social Sciences/Social Studies is your Teaching Area 2, KIN 306.3: Introduction to Indigenous Wellness can be used as part of this teaching area (INDG & CDN).
- 6. ****If **Practical and Applied Arts (PAA)** is your Teaching Area 2, you must enrol in both ECUR 340.3 and ECUR 341.3, one is considered your Teaching Area 2 Methods course and the other replaces the EADM/ECUR/EFDT/EPSE 411.3 requirement.
