The Bachelor of Science Kinesiology/Bachelor of Education Combined Program is designed for those students who wish to teach Physical Education at the Secondary level. All students in the Kinesiology/Education Combined Program have two teaching areas:

1. Teaching Area 1 is Physical Education. Teaching Area 1 must have a minimum average of 60%.
2. Teaching Area 2 options are listed below. In most cases, Teaching Area 2 requires 6 junior (100-level) credit units and 9 senior (200-level or higher) credit units. Teaching Area 2 must have a minimum average of 60%. 3. If Social Sciences/Social Studies is one of your teaching areas, at least 6 credit units must contain Canadian content. See the website listed above for a list of courses that have Canadian content.
