2025-2026 SoTL Research Grants

The Jane and Ron Graham Centre for the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) is committed to providing the development of capacity for SoTL research among faculty and students. The Graham Centre for SoTL recognizes the importance of providing support to University of Saskatchewan faculty, masters and doctoral students to enable them to develop and prepare high quality SoTL research projects. To this end, the Centre has established three grants to support this commitment:

- SoTL Flicker Grant, \$2,500 (for graduate students)
- SoTL Spark Grant, \$5,000 (for faculty new to SoTL)
- SoTL Ignite Grant, \$10,000 (for faculty experienced in SoTL)
- SoTL Flare Grant, \$25,000 (for SoTL research within a College or School, lead by tenure track faculty).

Scholarly Teaching Certificate (STC)

Advance Your Teaching. Lead in Learning

The Scholarly Teaching Certificate is a new non-credit professional learning program at the University of Saskatchewan designed for mid-career and/or professors of teaching who want to take their teaching to the next level. This certificate supports faculty in moving beyond effective teaching toward scholarly teaching - a critical step for those who aspire to lead in teaching and learning within their academic units or engage in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL).

The STC is designed to help you:

- Deepen your teaching practice through engagement with educational literature and evidence-based strategies.
- Reflect critically on your instructional choices and their impact on student learning.
- Lead and mentor by supporting colleagues, guiding curriculum initiatives, and contributing to a culture of teaching excellence.
- Engage in scholarly inquiry that connects your teaching to broader conversations in higher education.
- Build a foundation in SoTL - whether you plan to publish, present, or mentor others in scholarly teaching.
- Strengthen your teaching dossier for leadership roles, awards, and recognition.

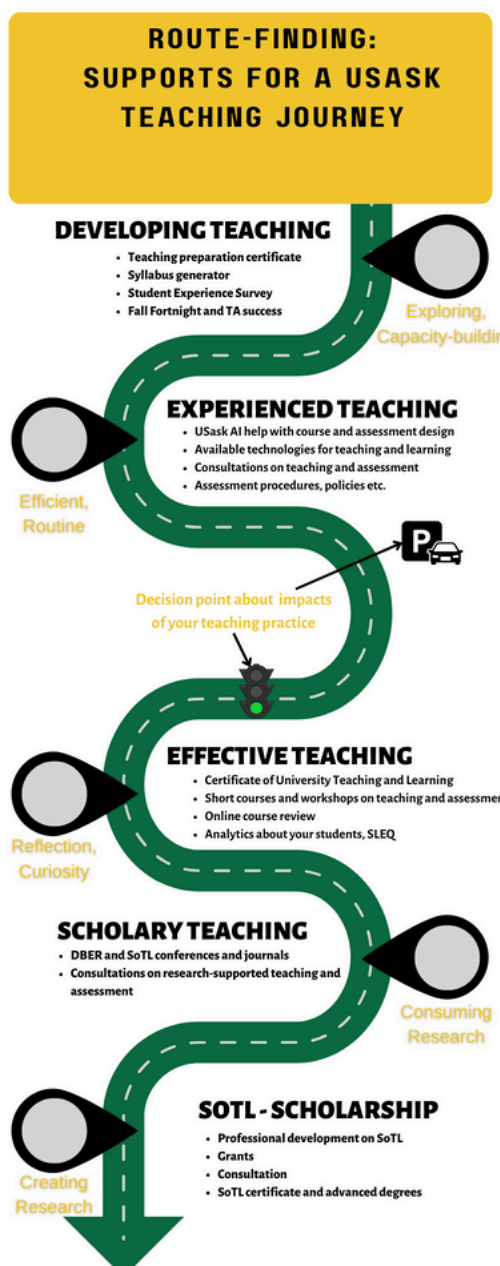
